Dear Resident,

The Village of Fox Point has long held a standard for a high quality of life in a community with a semi-rural feel close to an urban environment. In order to ensure that this living standard is preserved the Village Board has enacted several ordinances that may relate to construction projects and with this semi-rural environment comes narrow roads and an on-street parking prohibition.

As you begin a remodeling project at your home, we are providing a few guidelines that have been issues for your neighbors in the past and are asking that you share them with your contractors to help facilitate a smooth flow of traffic, access for emergency vehicles, and a peaceful environment for your neighbors. Depending on the size of your project, many tradespersons and deliveries may be needed.

Parking and Deliveries (§870-7):

- Parking on all Village streets is prohibited unless the driveway is otherwise unavailable or full.
- When on-street parking is permitted; park on one side of the street, preferably in front of your residence.
- Dumpsters and landscape materials cannot be left in the roadway without first obtaining permission from the police department.
- If the project plan involves many different trades / vehicles, please contact the police department to develop a parking plan to minimize the impact on the neighborhood.

Construction Times / Noise (§670-2):

- The use of construction equipment or related work is restrict to the hours of 7am-7pm weekdays and 9am-5pm on Saturdays.
- During the approved hours, radios / stereos should be used at a volume appropriate to keep the noise from disturbing neighbors.
