Fall is in the air and leaves will shortly be laying on the ground. Village Ordinance 292-8 states: Persons engaged in gathering leaves and yard waste shall not place or blow the same onto or across Village streets. Leaves and yard waste shall be placed or deposited upon the private property of the owner or resident causing such placement or deposit, or upon the right-of-way abutting the same property from which it was removed. This subsection shall not apply when leaves and yard waste are blown from the originating property of placement or deposited by wind.



Police Blotter

The summer has been very busy in Fox Point. Officers made (5) Operating While Intoxicated arrests, (4) Disorderly Conduct arrests, (3) Possession of Marijuana arrests along with a possession of heroin arrest. Officers were very busy making traffic stops

and locating individuals with outstanding warrants through our department and other jurisdictions. In total, officers arrested 21 different individuals with outstanding warrants.

Not only have officers been busy arresting individuals who have broken the law, officers responded to numerous complaints of theft, (6) retail thefts, (1) theft from an auto, (4) thefts of copper gutters, (1) theft of a hammock, (1) theft of a cell phone that someone left unattended at Dr's Park, and a theft of a Playstation 4. Officers also responded to 8 separate identity theft complaints.

The village's DPW was also a victim of theft this summer when workers were cutting grass, an unknown person removed 3 trimmers from the DPW truck. In mid-July, Officers took a rash of damage to property complaints, where some unknown persons damaged 8 separate mailboxes in a few block area around Bradley Road and North Regent Rd.
